



RECOVERY FUNDS TO HELP SHERMAN COUNTY

SALEM - The Oregon Department of Energy awarded \$458,000 in American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funds to one energy project in Sherman County. The funds are part of the State Energy Program for energy efficiency and renewable energy projects.

Sherman County will use the funds to install heating and cooling system upgrades. The existing system consists of a steam boiler, patented in 1917, serving steam radiators and window air conditioning units.

The project is expected to save 19,924 kilowatt hours of electricity per year, enough to heat 1.7 average Oregon homes per year.
